



 ***THE GAELIC KINGDOM OF

AN ACT OF THE GRAND ASSEMBLY

YEAR OF OUR MONARCH, 2025

 **Title of Act**

An act for the allowance for citizens to change their registered name with the law.

This act may be cited as the Change of Name Act 2025.



PREAMBLE

Be it enacted by the Queen’s most Excellent Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Grand Assembly of the Gaelic Kingdom of Mabruenia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Article I – Definitions

For the purpose of this act–

1. “Deed poll” refers to the document in which a person denounces their old name in favour of a new name.

Article II – Provisions

1. Under this act, any person may change their personal and/or family name(s) in public records with the issuance of a deed poll.
 2. A deed poll must include: the old name, a written denouncement of the old name, the new name, a written order that the new name must be used, the old signature, the new signature, and the signatures of two witnesses.
 3. When a deed poll is submitted and/or published, it becomes an offence, at the claimants discretion to whether they choose to prosecute or not, for an individual or group to knowingly and purposefully use the old name to refer to the person. This offence is an infraction.
 4. Upon submission or publication of the deed poll, officials are required to, in a timely manner, amend any and all known documents containing the old name, changing it to the new one. This includes any identification, citizenship records, contracts, and other legal documents.
 5. The only document a deed poll cannot change the name on is a birth certificate. The deed poll must be included as an attachment to the birth certificate.
 6. It is the recognised legal principle that the name you choose to use is your lawful name, and so the primary purpose of a deed poll is to have the name changed on previous official documentation. The secondary purpose of a deed poll is to recognise a change of name, although this is not necessary for future documentation to use the new name.

Enforcement

1. This act shall be enforced by Her Majesty's Ministry of Citizenship.
2. Any violations of this act shall be subject to penalties determined by the Ministry of Justice.

Article IV — Implementation

1. This Act shall come into force upon receiving **Royal Assent** from Her Majesty the Queen.
