# *Royal Dress Code of 2025*

*"To honor our heritage through dignity, discipline, and decorum."*

*Decree No. 11 of 2025, issued by Her Majesty the Queen of Mabruenia.*

---

## *I. Purpose and Authority*

The **Royal Dress Code of 2025** establishes the official standards of attire within the Kingdom of Mabruenia. It ensures that all royal, governmental, and military appearances reflect the dignity of the nation and its traditions. This code is enacted under **Royal Decree Number 11** and enforced by the

Ministry of State Affairs and Ceremonial Affairs, in cooperation with the **Ministry of Defense** and **Office of the Chancellor**.

## *II. Categories of Dress*

The Dress code recognizes four categories of attire:

1. **Royal Attire** – Worn by the Royal Family and court officials.
  2. **Military Uniforms** – Worn by active service members and ceremonial guards.
  3. **Government & Diplomatic Attire** – For officials during state or parliamentary functions.
  4. **Civilian Ceremonial Attire** – For citizens attending royal or state events.

## *III. Royal Attire*

### **A. Monarch**

- The Sovereign shall wear the **Crown Uniform** for state ceremonies, consisting of: Deep crimson robe with gold embroidery of the Mabruenian Crest, Sash of the Crown, crown or diadem appropriate to the occasion, and an optional ceremonial sword.

### **B. Royal Family**

- Male Members: Royal Blue uniform coat with silver trim and family insignia.
  - Female Members: Gown or tailored attire in national colors (blue, red, white), worn with the family order ribbon.
  - All members: May wear medals and orders granted by the Crown.

## *IV. Military Uniforms*

### **A. Service Dress**

- Standard day-to-day uniform.
- Includes insignia, rank badges, and service ribbons.

### **B. Ceremonial Dress**

- Worn during parades, coronations, and military funerals.
- Red coat with polished brass buttons and ceremonial sword.
- Medals displayed in order of precedence, from right to left (highest to lowest).

### **C. Field Uniform**

- Standard camouflage or operational pattern.
  - Simplified insignia, no medals.

## *V. Government & Diplomatic Attire*

- The **Chancellor, Ministers, and Ambassadors** shall wear formal dress during royal audience or parliamentary ceremonies.
  - Male officials: Black or dark navy suit, sash of office, and ribbon bar (If decorated)
  - Female officials: Dress or formal wear with official pin or sash of rank.
  - Foreign diplomats may wear national attire if approved by protocol.

## *VI. Civilian Ceremonial Attire*

- Citizens attending royal events or national celebrations should wear:
  - Traditional Mabruenian dress (optional)
  - Or formal attire in subdued national colors.

Medals awarded by the state may be worn on the left chest, miniatures at evening functions.

## *VII. Wearing of Medals and Ribbons*

- **Full-size medals:** Worn on the left chest during daytime ceremonies.
- **Miniature medals:** Worn on evening or formal occasions.
- **Ribbons only:** Worn during official duty or informal functions.

Medals are worn in order of precedence as designated by the **Royal Honors Committee**.

---

## *VIII. Enforcement and Exceptions*

- The **Royal Ceremonial Office** may issue specific attire guidelines for coronations, funerals, and other events.

- Exemptions may be granted by royal permission or medical necessity.
  - Unauthorized wearing of royal or military insignia is punishable under the **Royal Symbols Protection Act**.
