



Royal Federal Act No. 16, Year 2025

The Constituency Boundaries and Representation Act

Introduced by: The Monarch of Mabruenia

Category: Legislative

Preamble

To ensure fair, balanced, and equitable representation of the citizens of Mabruenia within the Grand Assembly, this Act establishes the framework for defining, reviewing, and administering parliamentary constituencies, and guarantees proportional representation under the Crown.

Section I – General Provisions

1. The Kingdom of Mabruenia shall be divided into **constituencies**, each represented by **one Member of the Grand Assembly (MGA)**.
 2. Constituencies shall be established based upon **population, geography, and historical boundaries**, in accordance with this Act.
 3. The **Royal Electoral Commission (REC)** shall oversee the creation, alteration, or abolition of constituencies under the authority of the Crown and Parliament.

Section II – Composition of the Grand Assembly

1. The Grand Assembly shall consist of a **minimum of 20 and a maximum of 30 Members**, as determined by population census.
 2. Representation shall be based on **one Member per 2 citizens**, with adjustments following every national census.
 3. The Crown, upon the advice of the Chancellor, may authorize **additional representation** for regions of cultural or historical importance.

Section III – Boundary Review

1. The **Royal Electoral Commission** shall conduct a **Boundary Review** every **ten years**, or sooner by royal directive.
2. The Commission shall consider:
 - a. Population shifts and urban expansion
 - b. Preservation of local communities and cultural identities

- c. Accessibility and administrative coherence
 3. Proposed boundary changes shall be presented to the **Grand Assembly for approval**, followed by **Royal Assent**.

Section IV – Constituency Names and Capitals

1. Each constituency shall bear a **formal title** derived from its principal city, town, or historical province.
 2. Constituency capitals shall serve as administrative centers for electoral purposes and regional governance.
 3. All official constituency titles shall be published in the *Register of the Realm* and the *Royal Gazette*.

Section V – Representation and Eligibility

1. To serve as a Member of the Grand Assembly, a candidate must:
 - a. Be a **citizen of Mabruenia** for no less than five years,
 - b. Be at least **17 years of age**,
 - c. Reside in or maintain legal residence within the constituency they represent.
 2. No Member shall hold dual office with any judicial or military command while seated in the Grand Assembly.

Section VI – Special Representation

1. The Crown may, by royal proclamation, grant **non-voting honorary representation** to overseas territories, protectorates, or autonomous regions.
 2. Indigenous, religious, and minority communities may petition for **special constituencies**, as recognized by the Assembly and Crown.

Section VII – Enactment and Oversight

1. This Act shall be administered by the **Royal Electoral Commission** and the **Ministry of Provincial Affairs**.
2. Any boundary or representation dispute shall be referred to the **Constitutional Chamber of the Royal Court** for adjudication.
3. This Act supersedes all prior laws or decrees concerning electoral boundaries and representation.
